- ▶ The general administration department deals with financial support and all of the association's administrative work.



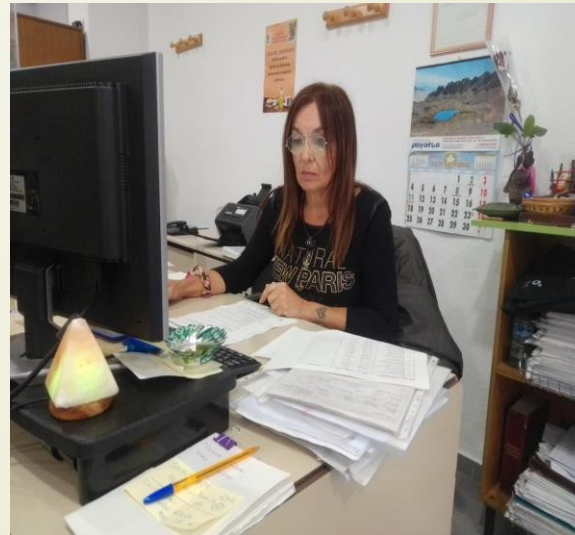
German department

- ▶ The German department is responsible for advising countries such as Germany, Austria, Switzerland, the Netherlands, England and Australia, etc.



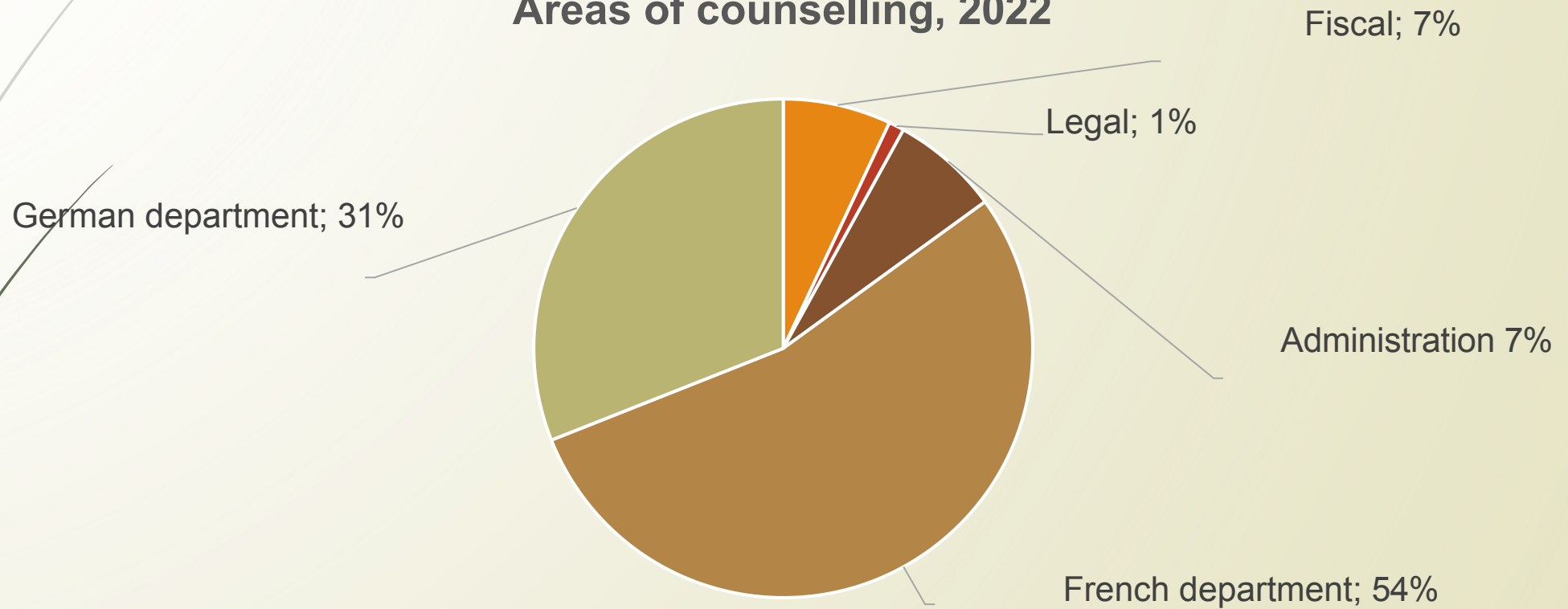
French department

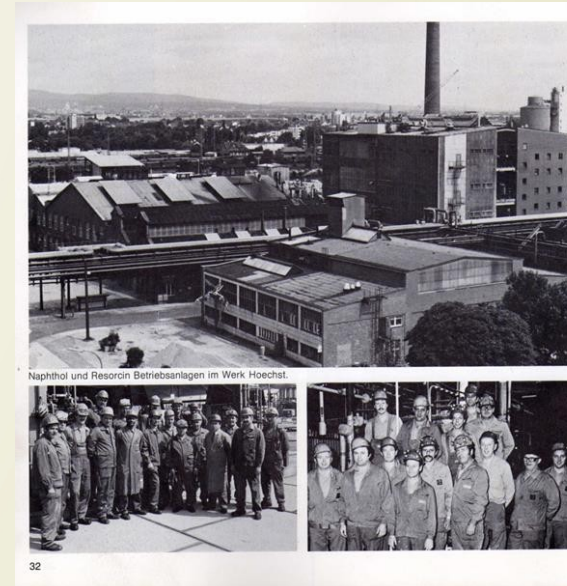

Differences between past and present emigration

 - ▶ The type of work has changed. When emigrating in the 60s, In the 70s and 80s, these were jobs for which there was no special qualification was required and for which no language skills were necessary.
- ▶ Emigration in those years consisted of the emigration of families.
- ▶ The aim of emigration back then was to earn money in order to and improve the economic situation.
